1. What is one thing the Bible teaches us about God?
2. If the Bible is a "light," what kind of "darkness" does it help protect us from?
3. How does God's Word guide us?

5. What is a practical, consistent time we can spend time reading the Bible as a family (e.g., after dinner, before school)?

Learn

Psalm says that God's Word is a lamp or light that guides us. (Turn off the lights and hold up a flashlight.) Why do we need the "light" the Word of God offers us? Life can be like walking in the dark on a windy path, that is, that's what it's like living life without God. The Bible or God's Word is like God's lamp or a flashlight that shines in front of our feet keeping us from falling or ending up on the wrong path. We all have access to that "light", but (Turn off the flashlight for a moment then turn it back on.) we must choose to turn it on, by opening our Bibles and reading them. The Bible is not just a book filled with old stories; it is the living, active, perfect, error-free instruction manual for how we should live and know Jesus.
